

## **Hay Visitors Information Centre**

Council has been registered as an Accredited Visitors Information Centre (VIC) for a number of years. There has been a number of changes in the Tourism industry in the past year, with the Regional Tourism Organisations being disbanded by Destination NSW, Hay being shifted from the Outback and Inland Group back into the Riverina, and now some changes to reporting in accredited VIC's. As has become the norm in the governance with the tourism sector, there has been no consultation with Local Government, the largest provider of tourism services on the ground.

Accreditation of NSW VIC's has been handled by a Dubbo based company, Aurora Research, until 2016. At the end of 2016, Destination NSW contracted the accreditation process to a Queensland based company, The Tourism Group. Some changes instituted by the Tourism Group required an increase in reporting of nonsensical data, which will increase the work load of VIC staff state wide.

With the increased reporting and lack of representation and consultation, Council staff has started questioning the value of being an Accredited Visitor Information Centre. In conversation with other Councils at the last Tourism Conference, it was gauged that Hay is not the only VIC that is questioning the value of being accredited.

At the March Ordinary meeting Council considered a proposal that the Hay VIC becomes an independent VIC, and not accredited.

The report set out a proposal that would see Hay develop its own 'Tourism Information' sign to replace the trademark yellow 'i' sign. The new sign would be designed to be more internationally recognisable and have better visibility while fitting in with a rustic and heritage like look to suit Hay's tourism product.

The proposed new sign may not only be used for the Hay VIC, but also for "Visitor Info Points" throughout Hay, where local businesses can request a small sign, brochures and maps, and also become a source of information to visitors. This will tie in to the "Aussiehost Town" initiative of 2014, where the idea behind it was that every participating business becomes a tourism marketing node. Council can supply businesses with brochures, a brochure stand and signage, which can be funded from the savings in accreditation fees. Council has also had some interest from businesses in the wider Outback region using the same branding. After consideration of the proposal Council resolved:-

- That the Hay Shire Council Visitors Information Centre cease to be an Accredited Visitor Information Centre.
- That Hay Shire Council creates its own Visitors Information brand, using a white "i" on brown background.
- That Hay Shire Council notifies businesses of the potential to become an "Info Point", and provide them a logo, brochures and maps to market the town with their customers.
- That Council further investigate using the white on brown "i" with businesses in the Outback region that have shown interest, using the term "Outback Visitors Info" instead of Hay Visitors Info.

#### REMOVAL OF WOOD IN PUBLIC AREAS

Below is an extract from the Local Government Act 1993 that states it is an offence to remove wood, dead or alive from public places, which in Hay, includes areas such as Sandy Point, Soapworks, Cemetery Bend, Madman's and Bushy Bend.

Recently there have been several trailer loads of wood taken from Sandy Point and Council advises the public that such action constitutes and offence.

A person who, without lawful excuse, removes any plant, animal, rock or soil from a public place is guilty of an offence.

Maximum penalty: 20 penalty units (\$2200)

# Unregistered Vehicles

Council would like to remind residents that unregistered vehicles parked on road shoulders or in public areas, including carparks, are considered abandoned and can be impounded.

## Council Works in Progress

The status of Council's operations is as follows:

- Grading Main Road 501 reconstruct and seal works have commenced. A primer seal to the first 2.5km of the 5km project was applied 8/3/17. The remaining 2km is currently being reconstructed in preparation for a primer seal next Wednesday.
- Grading Bairds Lane Reconstruct and seal project has commenced and the first 800m has been sealed.
- Bridges Replacement of two small timber bridges with large concrete culverts on MR 319 between Maude and Ravensworth.
- Sewer Replacement of aged sewer manhole in Lachlan Street at the Simpson Street intersection. RMS has assisted Council with the planning of the works as the project will involve a large excavation in Lachlan Street. The expected project timeframe is five days. The project will include traffic control, sewer rising main bypass, site establishment, removal of old brick manhole, construction of new manhole and back fill. Project commencement date 3rd April 2017
- Weeds Weed spraying in town including the lanes as well as some sections of sealed Rural Roads.
- Footpath Replacement and extension of the footpath in Church Lane to link Lachlan Street to Myers Lane units.
- Trees Separate contractors have been engaged to remove the trees in Hay pond enclosure and the raising of the trees in Lachlan Street.
- Weeds Property inspection are being conducted.
