

Draft Developer Service Plan on Exhibition

Council, in order to help determine any future expansion of the Hay town water supply network, has drafted a Developer Servicing Plan for Water Supply and Sewerage for Hay.

Council has had several requests to connect to Council's filtered water supply outside the current service area. Any additional connections will exacerbate the already insufficient peak demand capacity issues in the systems. As the Hay township is of approximately 2,400 people and 1,300 connections, it is trying to find the balance of adequate supply and who pays between Council, new development connections, and existing connected properties.

The DSP has been prepared in accordance with the 2016 Developer Charges Guidelines for Water Supply, Sewerage and Stormwater issued by the Minister for Lands and Water, pursuant to section 306 (3) of the Water Management Act, 2000.

The Draft Developer Service Plan is now on exhibition for public comment. The draft DSP can be viewed on Council's website www.hay.nsw.gov.au or a hard copy is available for viewing at Council's Administration Centre, 134 Lachlan Street, Hay.
